Eddie Redmayne stars as nineteenth-century real-life meteorologist James Glaisher in this Victorian ballooning adventure. Teaming up with a dare-devil balloon pilot (Felicity Jones), Glaisher sets out on a reckless voyage. Visually wondrous, with charismatic performances from the stars of *The Theory of Everything*, *The Aeronauts* takes to the skies and soars. Fans of the classic, old-style British adventure epic are in for a treat.



A SHAUN THE SHEEP MOVIE: FARMAGEDDON (U)

Prepare for close encounters of the furred kind: *Farmageddon* takes all the misadventure and heart-warming fun of the first *Shaun the Sheep* film and adds a sci-fi twist, offering a steady stream of visual and verbal gags that will delight the whole family. When the impish and adorable alien Lu-La crash-lands near Mossy Bottom Farm, Shaun sees an opportunity for adventure. He makes it his mission to shepherd the extra-terrestrial back to her home planet before a sinister agency can capture her.



THE GOOD LIAR (15)

Romantic thriller in which career con artist, the whip-smart Roy Courtney (Ian McKellen), meets wealthy widow Betty McLeish (Helen Mirren) online. Roy has successfully lied all his life and as Betty opens her home and life to him, he thinks he has it all worked out for his next victim. 'But this time it will be different...' and soon Roy is taken aback when his feelings for Betty are not what he expected. That's before he discovers that there's more to Betty's story than it first appeared.

AFTER THE WEDDING (12A)

Isabel (Michelle Williams) has dedicated her life to working with children in a struggling orphanage in Calcutta. Theresa (Julianne Moore) is the multi-millionaire head of a media company who lives in New York. When word comes to Isabel of a generous grant for the orphanage, she must travel to New York to meet the benefactor – Theresa, where Isabel discovers a connection to Theresa that takes her on an unexpected journey into her own past. A poignant and intriguing tale of secrets and intersecting lives.

IT'S A WONDERFUL LIFE (U)

USA 1946. 130 mins.

One of the most popular and enduring films ever made, Capra's *It's a Wonderful Life* is a gloriously sentimental testament to homely small-town moral values. Masterfully crafted, the film opens with angels discussing George Bailey (James Stewart), a man so beset with problems that he contemplates suicide. As George prepares to jump from a bridge, his guardian angel intervenes and shows him how badly Bedford Falls would have turned out without his good deeds.



LE MANS '66 (CERT TBC)

Matt Damon and Christian Bale star in the remarkable true story of visionary American car designer Carroll Shelby (Matt Damon) and fearless British driver Ken Miles (Christian Bale), who together battled corporate meddling, the laws of physics, and their own demons to build a revolutionary race car for Ford Motor Company and take on the might of Enzo Ferrari at the 24 Hours of Le Mans in 1966.



LUCE (15)

6, 7, 11 & 12 DEC

Director: Julius Onah. **Starring:** Kelvin Harrison Jr., Naomi Watts, Octavia Spencer, Tim Roth. USA 2019. 110 mins.

Luce is a smart psychological thriller that will leave audiences breathless. An all-star high school athlete and accomplished debater, Luce (Kelvin Harrison Jr.) is a poster boy for the new American Dream. As are his parents (Naomi Watts and Tim Roth), who adopted him from a war-torn country a decade earlier. When Luce's teacher (Octavia Spencer) makes a shocking discovery in his locker, Luce's stellar reputation is called into question. But is he really at fault, or is Ms Wilson preying on dangerous stereotypes?

Contains strong language, sex and references to sexual assault.



LAST CHRISTMAS (12A)

A Christmas time romcom scripted around the songs of George Michael. Kate (Emilia Clarke, *Game of Thrones*) is down on her luck and has had to move back in with her mother (Emma Thompson). Then Tom (Henry Golding, *Crazy Rich Asians*) walks into her life, and it all seems too good to be true. A classic boy-meets-girl tale, set to become a perennial favourite for the holiday season.

Rian Johnson (*Looper*, *The Last Jedi*) pays tribute to mystery mastermind Agatha Christie in a fun, modern-day whodunit with a brilliant ensemble cast. When renowned crime novelist Harlan Thrombey is found dead at his estate just after his 85th birthday, the debonair Detective Benoit Blanc (Daniel Craig) is mysteriously enlisted to investigate. From Harlan's dysfunctional family to his devoted staff, Blanc sifts through a web of red herrings and self-serving lies to uncover the truth behind Harlan's untimely death.
