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FLAME & CITRON (15)

Director: Ole Christian Madsen. Starring: Mads Mikkelsen, Thure Lindhardt, Stine Stengade. Denmark 2008. 136 mins. Danish and German with English subtitles.



Copenhagen, 1944. Denmark is under Nazi occupation. Resistance fighters Flame and Citron work undercover for the Holger Danske group performing acts of sabotage and liquidating Danish informers. Unified in their hatred of enemies of freedom, the vounger, idealistic Flame dreams of openly taking up arms against the occupying power, whereas the more sensitive Citron finds himself drawn further into the politics of resistance. When Flame is commanded

to execute his girlfriend Ketty, an enigmatic courier, he questions his orders. The story is based on true events, with much of the plot and dialogue developed from eyewitness accounts. Avoiding the clichés of the genre, Madsen brings a piercing freshness of vision coupled with a real sense of history. SARAH LUTTON, THE TIMES BFI LONDON FILM FESTIVAL

THE CLASS (15)

Director: Laurent Cantet. Starring: Juliette Demaille, François Begaudeau. Wei Huang, Franck Keita, France 2008, 130 mins, French with English subtitles.



Based on the bestselling novel Entre les Murs by former teacher François Bégaudeau, the latest film from Cantet demonstrates his social and ethical conscience and his mastery of compelling human dramas. François and his fellow teachers prepare for a new year at a high school in a tough Paris neighbourhood. Neither stuffy nor severe, his extravagant frankness often takes the students by surprise. But his classroom ethics are put to the test when his students begin to challenge his teaching methods. A deserving Palme d'Or winner, THE CLASS gently teases out tensions and issues within the classroom, examining without didacticism and with extreme objectivity the various challenges the pupils and teachers face. Absolutely enthralling and utterly essential.

GRAN TORINO (15)

Director: Clint Eastwood. Starring: Clint Eastwood, Christopher Carley, Bee Vang. USA 2008, 116 mins.



Eastwood's first acting performance since MILLION DOLLAR BABY, GRAN TORINO is another distinguished entry into the director's series of films that ponder violence, its place and its cost. Decades after the Korean War, veteran Walt Kowalski (Fastwood) is still haunted by the horrors he witnessed. The two objects that matter most to Kowalski are the classic Gran Torino that represents his happier days working in a Ford

assembly plant, and the M-1 rifle that saved his life during combat. When his East Asian teenage neighbour (Vang) attempts to steal his Gran Torino, Kowalski discovers that the only way to lay his painful memories to rest is to face his own blinding prejudice head-on. Impeccably directed and performed, the film confirms Eastwood as perhaps the greatest living talent in American cinema.

CHE: PART TWO (15)

11 APR

Director: Steven Soderbergh, Starring: Benicio Del Toro. Catalina Sandino Moreno, Demián Bichir, Rodrigo Santoro. USA/Spain/France 2008. 127 mins. Spanish with English subtitles.



The second part of Soderbergh's remarkable portrait of Che Guevara covers the period up until his capture and death in 1967 and is set almost entirely in Bolivia. Che (Del Toro) faces the challenge of galvanising poor peasants into a revolutionary military force that can take on trained professionals. Soderbergh does a superb job in capturing the scale and gritty reality of guerrilla warfare. Del Toro disappears into his role and gives a monumental performance as the man who remains a potent international symbol of idealism and heroism. Under his Peter Andrews pseudonym, Soderbergh, arguably America's most consistent and consistently inventive living filmmaker, acts as his own cinematographer.

SLUMDOG MILLIONAIRE (15)

Director: Danny Boyle. Starring: Irfan Khan, Anil Kapoor, Dev Patel, Mia Drake. UK/USA 2008. 120 mins.

Jamal Malik, an 18-year-old orphan from the slums of Mumbai, is just one question away from winning 20 million rupees on India's Who Wants to be a Millionaire. But when the show breaks for the night. police arrest him on suspicion of cheating: how could a 'slumdog' know so much? Desperate to prove his innocence, Jamal tells the story of his life; tales of the slum where he and his brother grew up, of their adventures together on the road, of vicious encounters with local gangs, and of Latika, the girl he loved and lost.

FROM 3 APRIL

THE READER (15)

Director: Stephen Daldry. Starring: Kate Winslet, Ralph Fiennes, Bruno Ganz. USA/Germany 2008. 124 mins.

In post-World War II Germany, Michael Berg falls ill with scarlet fever and is nursed back to health by Hannah. Once recovered, Michael discovers that Hannah loves being read to, and the pair enter a passionate clandestine affair. When Hannah vanishes without a trace. Michael is left heartbroken and despondent. Fast-forward nearly a decade, and he is a law student observing Nazi war crime trials. When Hannah walks into the courtroom and sits in the defendant's chair, her past comes into focus and he uncovers the secret that will have a profound impact on both of their lives.

BOLT (U)

FROM 11 APR

Directors: Byron Howard, Chris Williams. Starring: John Travolta, Susie Essman, Mark Walton, Miley Cyrus. USA 2008. 87 mins.



From Disney comes BOLT, the tale of a superstar TV pup (Travolta) who gets plopped in the middle of America with seemingly no way back to the glam and glitz of Hollywood. Thanks to his starring role on a hit television show, Bolt has become a household name. But he has bought into his own heroic image, now believing that he really possesses the super-canine powers of his fictional television series. When he's accidentally shipped from Hollywood to New York

City, he must rely on his two newfound friends - an abandoned house cat named Mittens (Essman) and a television-addicted hamster named Rhino (Walton) - as he embarks on a cross-country quest to get back to his owner Penny (Cyrus).

THE BOAT THAT ROCKED (CERT TBC)

FROM 17 APR

Director: Richard Curtis. Starring: Philip Seymour Hoffman, Bill Nighy, Rhys Ifans. Nick Frost. UK 2009. TBC mins.



The new comedy from Curtis (LOVE ACTUALLY), centred on the British pirate radio revolution of the '60s, largely takes place in a rusty fishing trawler moored off the coast of England. In 1966, arguably British pop music's finest era, the BBC played only two hours of rock and roll every week. But pirate radio blasted rock and pop from the high seas 24 hours a day. And

25 million people - more than half the country's population - listened to these pirates every single day. An ensemble comedy in which the romance takes place between young people and pop music, the film also concerns a band of rogue DJs who captivated Britain, playing the music that defined a generation and stood up to a government that, incomprehensibly, preferred jazz.

Director: Larry Charles. Starring: Bill Maher. USA 2008. 101 mins.



Designed to polarise and unsettle, RELIGULOUS takes on the last sacred cow in American society, and everything that symbolises organised religion. The films aims to take a hammer of hard scepticism to the gossamer vault of faith. Because the men wielding that hammer are Bill Maher and Larry

Charles (BORAT), the result is hilarious. Maher criss-crosses the globe, travelling from Jerusalem to Vatican City to Salt Lake City, interviewing people about God and their own beliefs. His irreverent wit and blinding logic produce wild reactions from representatives of nearly every major faith. How could the universe have been created only 4000 years ago? What explains bad things happening to good people? What's with all the beards? The team of Maher and Charles lay down tough questions on what remains the world's most controversial topic.

IS ANYBODY THERE? (CERT TBC)

FROM 1 MAY Director: John Crowley. Starring: Michael Caine, Bill Milner, Anne-Marie Duff, David Morrissey. UK 2008. TBC mins.



Edward (Milner, SON OF RAMBOW) lives, somewhat reluctantly, in a rambling hospice for the aged, of which his parents are the managers. Surrounded by the elderly, he is fascinated by death, what happens afterwards, ghosts and the paranormal. With the arrival of the bitter, burned-out Clarence (Caine), Edward's interests take on an entirely different dimension. An ex-magician who has stopped practising his trade, the irascible Clarence no longer finds anything

positive anywhere or in anyone, and at first he is barely able to tolerate the young whippersnapper. But it is not long before they are drawn together as two outsiders trying to make sense of the world. Full of wit, wisdom and wistfulness, this film confronts death and the hereafter with humour and honesty.

THE AGE OF STUPID (12A)

FROM 9 MAY

Director: Franny Armstrong. Starring: Pete Postlethwaite. UK 2009. 92 mins.



Arguably the most important documentary of 2009, THE AGE OF STUPID is the new climate change blockbuster from Franny Armstrong, director of MCLIBEL, and John Battsek, producer of the Oscar-winning ONE DAY IN SEPTEMBER. Pete Postlethwaite stars as a man living alone in the environmental wasteland of 2055, looking back at footage from 2008 and

asking: why didn't we save ourselves when we had the chance? Contains bleeped strong language and reality footage of death and injury.

THE DAMNED UNITED (15)

Director: Tom Hooper. Starring: Michael Sheen, Timothy Spall, Jim Broadbent, Colm Meaney. UK 2009. 97 mins.



Peter Morgan's (FROST/NIXON) brilliant adaptation of David Peace's novel tells the confrontational and darkly humorous story of Brian Clough's doomed 44-day tenure as manager of the reigning champions of English football in the 1970s, Leeds United. Previously managed by his bitter rival Don Revie, and on the back of their most successful period ever, Leeds had an aggressive and cynical style of football. This was an anathema to the

principled yet flamboyant Brian Clough, who had achieved astonishing success as manager of Hartlepool and Derby County building teams in his own vision with trusty lieutenant Peter Taylor (Spall). The performances are riveting, with Sheen (FROST/NIXON) and Meaney excellent as Clough and Revie respectively.

FIFTY DEAD MEN WALKING (15)

FROM 9 MAY

Director: Kari Skogland. Starring: Ben Kingsley, Jim Sturgess, Kevin Zegers, Nathalie Press. UK/Canada 2008. 117 mins.



Martin McGartland (Sturgess) is a small-time hustler working in late-Eighties Belfast. He is recruited by a complex, wily intelligence agent (Kingsley) to feed information about Irish Republican Army activities to the British. With every success, he intensifies the danger posed to himself and his family. The IRA is ruthless in its retribution once

it learns of an infiltrator: he becomes a "dead man walking". But McGartland finds the grip of his relationship with the agent both hard to shake and secretly comforting. Inspired by McGartland and Nicholas Davies' book, Kari Skogland captures the character of Northern Ireland in the Eighties with great sensitivity and precision, reflecting both the despair and the personal toll of the conflict.

MODERN LIFE (PG)

FROM 10 MAY

Director: Raymond Depardon. France 2008. 87 mins. French with English subtitles.



An intimate portrait that necessitated unlimited access, MODERN LIFE offers a witness to farmers' lives, values, family stories and all that binds them to the land. The film is the result of ten years spent filming the French farming communities of former photographer Depardon's

youth. He examines their legacies and questions what will become of the farmers and their relatively uncomplicated existence in the face of rapidly advancing modernity. Disproving the notion that small-scale agriculture is dead, the film is reminiscent of Nicolas Philibert's ÊTRE ET AVOIR. Beautifully unhurried (Depardon largely proceeds in long uninterrupted shots to enable the farmers to speak for themselves), MODERN LIFE is a bewitching and charming documentary quaranteed to leave you with a smile on your face.

IN THE LOOP (15)

FROM 15 MAY

Director: Armando lannucci. Starring: James Gandolfini, Tom Hollander, Chris Addison. Anna Chlumsky. UK 2009. 106 mins.



Directed by master satirist lannucci and written by the team that brought you The Thick of It, IN THE LOOP is a razor-sharp political comedy. The US President and British Prime Minister fancy a war. The British Secretary of State for International Development, Simon Foster (Hollander), disagrees. But when he accidentally backs military action on prime-time TV, he suddenly has a lot of friends in Washington. If he can get in with

the right D.C. people, if his entourage of one (Addison) can sleep with the right intern, and if he can stop the UN vote being rigged, he can halt the war. If he can't... well, he can always sack his advisor, whom he never liked anyway. The film pulls no political punches and is both pertinent and wickedly funny.

GOOD (15)

FROM 22 Ma Director: Vicente Amorim. Starring: Viggo Mortensen, Jason Isaacs, Jodie Whittaker, Gemma Jones. USA 2008. 96 mins.



GOOD, which is based on the acclaimed play by C. P. Taylor, stars Mortensen (APPALOOSA) in an extraordinary change-of-pace role as John Halder, a good, decent individual with family problems. A German literature professor in the 1930s, Halder explores his personal circumstances in a novel advocating compassionate euthanasia. When the book is unexpectedly enlisted by powerful political figures in support of government propaganda. Halder

finds his career rising in an optimistic current of nationalism and prosperity. Yet with his change in fortune, his seemingly inconsequential decisions potentially jeopardise the people in his life with devastating effects.

STATE OF PLAY (CERT TBC)

FROM 22 May Director: Kevin Macdonald. Starring: Ben Affleck, Russell Crowe, Helen Mirren, Rachel McAdams. USA 2009. TBC mins.



THE LAST KING OF SCOTLAND director Macdonald teams with screenwriter Tony Gilroy (MICHAEL CLAYTON) for this American adaptation of the hit British miniseries concerning the suspicious circumstances that set a rising congressman and a dogged reporter on a dangerous collision course. Handsome and unflappable Stephen Collins is ascending the ladder of power in his party with unprecedented speed. But when his research assistant/mistress is viciously

murdered, some unsavoury truths begin to surface. Back in the day, Collins was a close friend of Cal McAffrey, now a top reporter in Washington. Assigned the task of investigating Collins by his ruthless editor Cameron, McAffrey recruits fellow reporter Della in order to track down the truth and identify the killer.






